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Kate's Race

So many things have changed here at Hope Cancer, but one thing that's remained is Kate's Race. Named for Kate Schultz Colon, a lovely woman who fought a tough battle with cancer. Kate was just two months into her senior year at Columbia International University when she found out that she had Osteosarcoma. This is the most common type of bone cancer and the sixth most common type of cancer in children. Kate was among HCM's first patients and during her remission, she attended a HCM Training Workshop and became an active volunteer. She

was like so many of our volunteers who want to help others dealing with similar diagnosis. While time prohibited her from working directly with a patient, she inspired many with her strength in God and her assurance of eternity with Christ. Her contagious hope amidst her long, valiant battle, deeply touched all who came in contact with her. Kate had the joy of walking with a teenager from Rock Hill through Osteosarcoma, she visited her in the hospital doing face painting, and spending time together. The young lady is a survivor and enjoyed the time they spent to-

gether. Kate exhibited an optimism that only comes from having eternal hope. It was a sad loss to her family, both close and extended when she lost the battle, but rejoiced in her embrace into heaven and no more pain. Kate's Race is in her memory and honor of her life and so many HCM has had the blessings to touch. We lost Kate eight years ago and we are honored to keep her legacy alive and invite you to join us in remembering her and so many others. Cancer Prevention Study-3 Champion

Cancer Prevention Study 3 (CPS-3) is a research study funded by the American Cancer Society and facilitated by the Society's Department of Epidemiology and Surveillance Research. The purpose of CPS-3 is to better understand the factors (lifestyle, environmental, genetic) that cause or prevent cancer. The goal is to enroll at least 300,000 adults by December 2013. Participants of the study are between

the ages of 30-65 and will be followed for approximately 20 years through surveys asking for detailed updates on health, lifestyle choices and environmental exposures. A CPS-3 Champion will help to promote the enrollment sites for the study and invite 10 friends to participate and can be survivor. There will be 12 enrollment sites across Mecklenburg county.
